IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

Important Safety Information

1. **CAUTION:** Do not operate the appliance with glass removed, cracked, or broken. Replacement of the panel(s) should be done by a licensed or qualified service person.
2. Do not use this appliance if any part has been under water. Immediately call a qualified service technician to inspect the appliance and to replace any part of the control system and any gas control which has been under water.
3. Due to high temperatures, the appliance should be located out of traffic and away from furniture and draperies.
4. Children and adults should be alerted to the hazards of high surface temperature and should stay away to avoid burns or clothing ignition.
5. Clothing or other flammable material should not be placed on or near the appliance.
6. Young children should be carefully supervised when they are in the same room as the appliance. Toddlers, young children, and others may be susceptible to accidental contact burns. A physical barrier is recommended if there are at-risk individuals in the house. To restrict access to a fireplace or stove, install an adjustable safety gate to keep toddlers, young children, and other at-risk individuals out of the room and away from hot surfaces.
7. Any safety screen, guard or barrier removed for servicing an appliance must be replaced prior to operating the appliance.
8. Installation and repair should be done by a qualified service person. The appliance should be inspected before use and at least annually by a professional service person. More frequent cleaning may be required due to excessive lint from carpeting, bedding material, et cetera. It is imperative that control compartments, burners, and circulating air passageways of the appliance be kept clean. See maintenance instructions on *Page 29-32*.

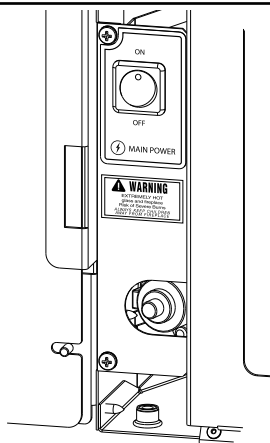

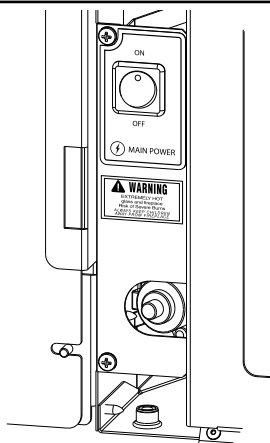

ORIFICE SIZE/ALTITUDE ADJUSTMENT

For altitudes above 2,000 feet, the orifice should be de-rated by 4% for every 1,000 feet to maintain the proper ratio of gas to air. Improper orifice sizing may result in damage and unsafe conditions. Changing the orifice should only be done by a qualified service technician. Contact your IHP dealer for proper orifice sizes.

SMOKE DETECTORS

Since there are always several potential sources of fire in any home, we recommend installing smoke detectors. If possible, install the smoke detector in a hallway adjacent to the room (to reduce the possibility of occasional false activation from the heat produced by the appliance). If your local code requires a smoke detector be installed within the same room, you must follow the requirements of your local code. Check with your local building department for requirements in your area.

These heaters are designed to be installed into an existing masonry fireplace (built to UBC 37 or ULC S628 standards) or factory built solid fuel, wood burning fireplace (listed to UL 127 or ULC S610) only. All exhaust gases must be vented outside the structure. Combustion air is drawn from outside the structure. When installing in a factory built fireplace, the fireplace grate must be removed and the damper must be removed or secured open.

IMPORTANT: When installing these appliances into a factory built fireplace or heat-form, the air flow within and around the fireplace shall not be altered by the installation of the insert (i.e. **DO NOT BLOCK** louvers or cooling air inlet or outlet ports, circulating air chambers in a steel fireplace liner or metal heat circulator).

CAUTION

- **Trim panels or surrounds must not seal ventilation openings in the existing fireplace that the appliance is installed in.**
- **The fireplace in which this gas insert is to be installed must be thoroughly cleaned if it has been used to burn wood or synthetic logs. Certification

Gas appliances must be tested and certified by a nationally recognized testing and certification laboratory to ANSI (American National Standard Institute) gas appliance safety standards.

This appliance has been tested and certified to ANSI Z21.88-2019/CSA 2.33-2019 Standard for Vented Gas Fireplace Heater and CSA 2.17-2017 and UL 307B Gas Burning Heating Appliances for Manufactured (Mobile) Homes.

This appliance has met all necessary ANSI Standards and is fully certified for installation in any community. If there are any questions or if you need further substantiation contact your IHP dealer. If you have further questions, please contact IHP.

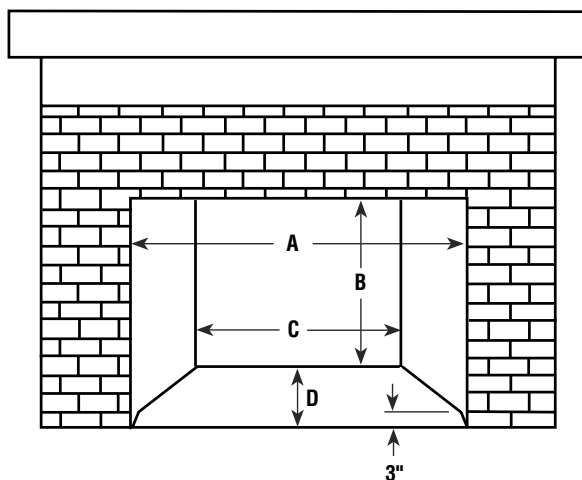


Figure 3 - Minimum Fireplace Cavity

CLEARANCES TO COMBUSTIBLES

Minimum Clearances to Combustibles

Minimum clearances include any projections such as shelves, window sills, mantels, spacers/standoffs or surfaces to combustible construction etc. above the appliance. Paint or lacquer used to finish the mantel must be heat resistant in order to avoid discoloration.

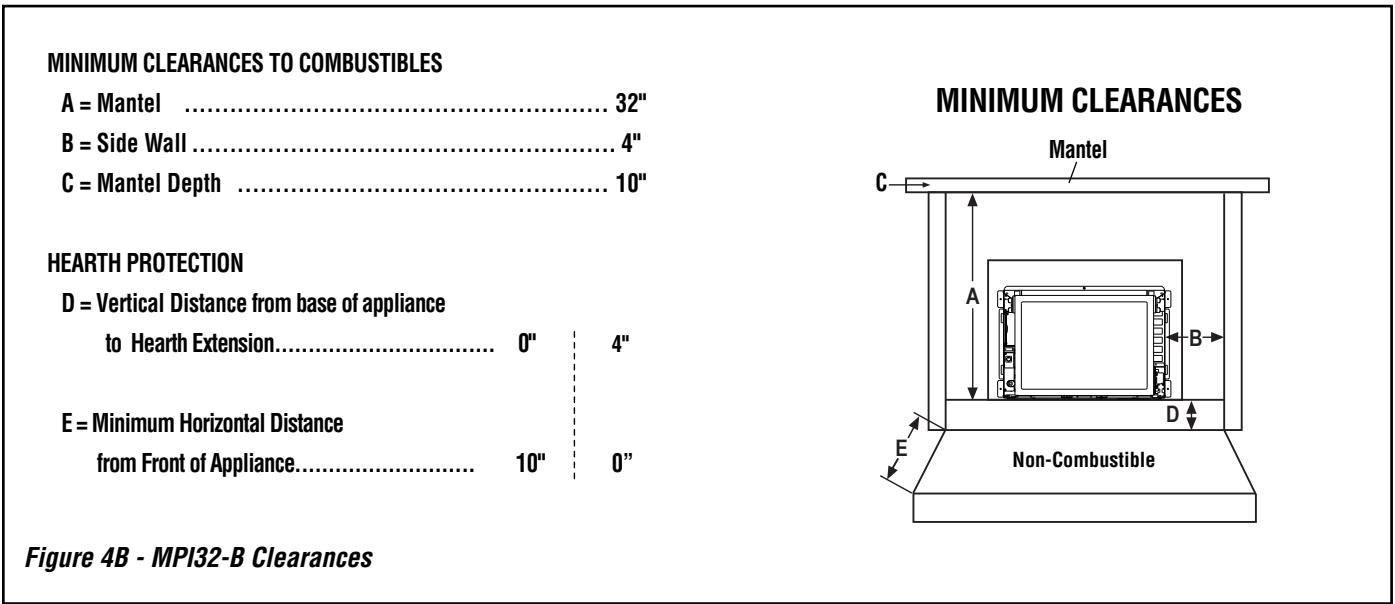
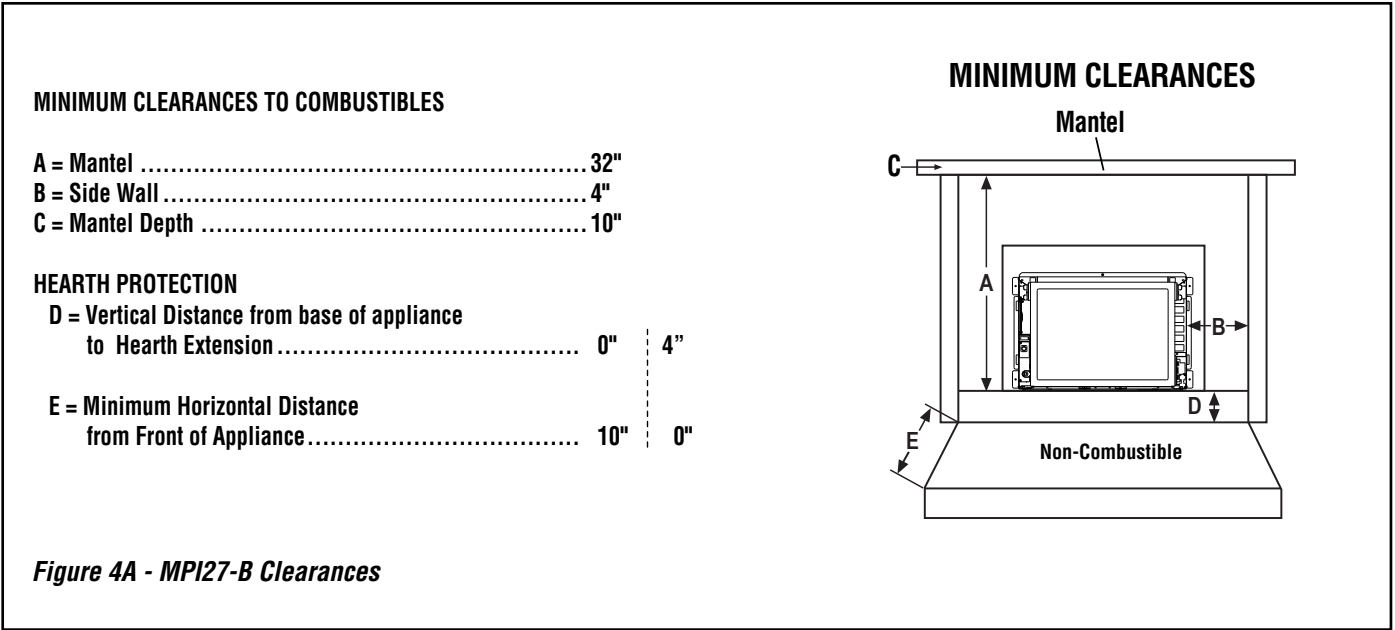
NOTE: Hearth protection to be min. 1/2" thick non-combustible or equivalent, with a k factor of .84.

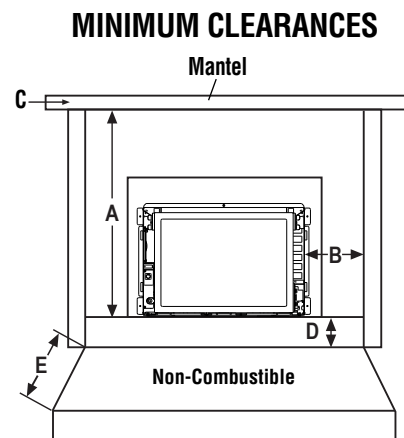


Figure 4C - MPI34-B Clearances

Facing and Mantel Clearances (see Figures 4A, 4B and 4C)

The letters in **Figures 4A, 4B and 4C** (A through E) show minimum clearances required from the appliance to combustibles and the minimum projection of the hearth extension.

Insert Leveling

At each front and rear corner of the insert is an adjustable leg provided to level the insert should the hearth of the fireplace be uneven. To adjust the legs, use a 1/4" wrench.

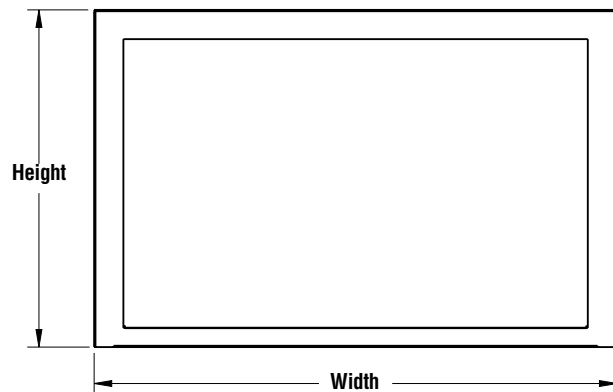


Figure 5 - Facade Dimensions

INSTALLATION

Venting Installation

Your IHP appliance must be vented to the outside in accordance with the current edition of the National Fuel Gas Code ANSI-Z223.1.

This appliance requires a 3" diameter listed flex liner. The vent should terminate with a listed direct-vent termination cap. The chimney should be sealed around the cap to prevent air and rain from entering the chimney. Adhere to the vent manufacturer's instructions for installation and vent termination. These appliances are approved for use with the following vent kits.

Preparation For Flex Liner Installation

The liner connector plate can be removed (as shown in **Figure 7**) to make it easier to connect the flex liners to the intake and exhaust collars. Re-install the liner connector plate when the insert is placed in the fireplace.

NOTE: Ensure gasket on connector plate is not damaged before re-installing.

The existing fireplace chimneys may take various contours which the flexible liners will accommodate. However, keep the flexible liner VERTICAL and avoid bending. When at maximum vertical height, standing pilot should be used for correct operation.

(UL1777 ONLY) for the EXHAUST

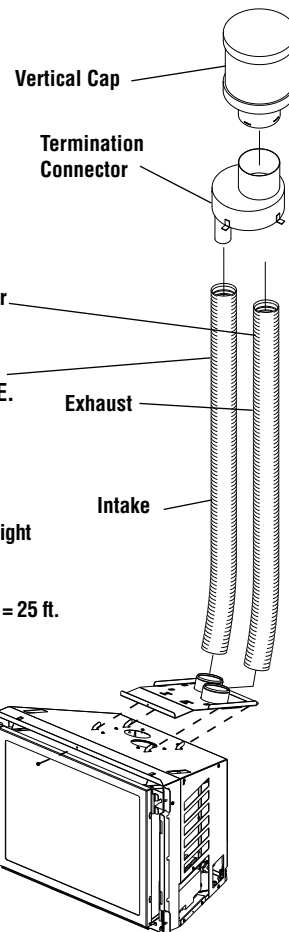

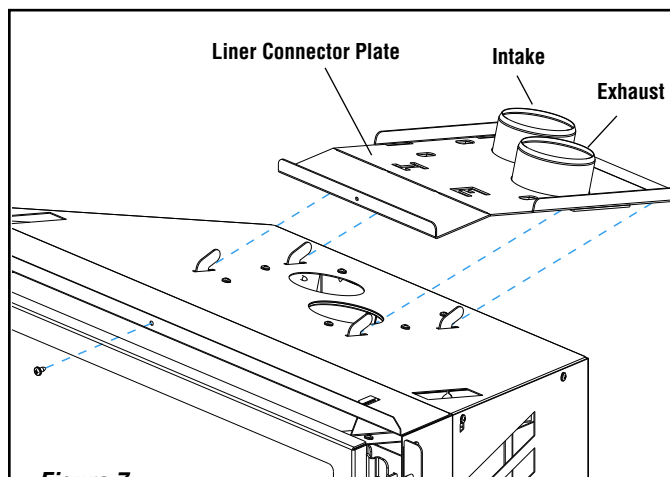

Vertical Venting (see Figure 6)

The vent pipes must be connected to the proper collars on the unit and the exhaust vent pipe must be connected to the termination cap or the unit will not operate. When done assure all connections are securely fastened.

The fireplace and fireplace chimney must be clean and in good working order and constructed of non-combustible materials. Inspect chimney cleanouts for proper fit and seal.

Make sure that both liners will pass through existing damper area. Remove or lock damper to allow the passage of the flexible liners. If the damper will not allow the passage of both liners, DO NOT PROCEED FURTHER. (If fireplace is masonry) Consult a local mason for removal of the damper without risk of structural damage or leakage. (If the fireplace is factory built) The appliance may NOT be installed into the fireplace.

WARNING

Direct-Vent Fireplace Insert Vent Requirements - Use liner listed to UL181 (Factory-made Air Ducts And Air Connectors) or UL1777 (Chimney Liners) for the AIR INTAKE. Use liner listed to UL1777 ONLY for the EXHAUST.

Do not substitute the heat-rated flex liner (UL1777) for the exhaust with any other type liner or a fire may result causing property damage, personal injury or loss of life.

Zero Clearance Fireplace Installation

This appliance may be installed in a masonry or factory built/zero clearance (ZC) fireplace. When installing in a ZC fireplace, the ZC grate must be removed and the ZC damper must be removed or secured open. The ZC doors, screen, refractory or masonry lining, baffles and smoke shelf may be removed if necessary to install the gas insert. However, do not cut or alter the fireplace components. The removal of any parts to facilitate installation must not alter the integrity of the inner or outer shells of the fireplace cabinet. Any parts removed must be replaceable if the insert is taken out of the fireplace or the fireplace clearly marked with a paint stick that "This fireplace has been altered and is no longer safe to operate."

If the factory-built fireplace has no gas access hole(s) provided, an access hole of 1-1/2" or less may be drilled through the lower sides or bottom of the firebox in a proper workmanship like manner. This access hole must be plugged with a non-combustible insulation after the gas supply line has been installed.

The installer must mechanically attach the marking supplied with the gas fireplace insert to the inside of the firebox of the fireplace into which the gas fireplace insert is installed. See Figure 1 on Page 11.

Flue Restrictor

The flue restrictor settings shown in Figure 8 are for typical installations and are based upon laboratory testing. To achieve proper combustion, adjustments may be needed to account for variables in the installation, elevation, and typical operating temperatures.

Allow the appliance to burn for at least 10 minutes before determining proper flame appearance. If the proper flame appearance cannot be achieved, the flue restrictor may need to be changed to a different position. See the following guidelines to determine if you need to readjust the flue restrictor.

Flue Restrictor Adjustment

1. Using a Phillips screw driver, remove the two screws holding the flue restrictor in place.
2. Refer to table in Figure 8 and position the flue restrictor to the recommended setting and reattach with the two screws removed in step 1.

Symptoms - Lack of Combustion Air

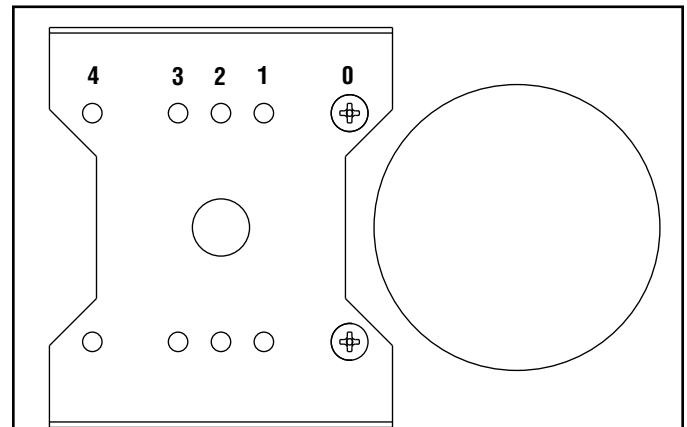
If the symptoms listed below are present, you may need to adjust the flue restrictor to a more open position.

- Flame appears yellow
- Floating Flames (lazy, ill defined, quiet, may roll)
- Sooting
- Pilot becomes yellow and appliance shuts down

Symptoms - Excessive Combustion Air

If the symptoms listed below are present, you may need to adjust the flue restrictor to a more closed position.

- Low Flame
- Pilot pulls and appliance shuts down
- Pilot flame ghosts

1. Remove the glass door following the instructions provided in this manual (**Page 30**).
2. Remove the long refractory liner panel retaining brackets from the front sides of the firebox (**Figure 9**).
3. Place the rear liner panel against the back of the Firebox and resting on the burner support tray.
4. One at a time, install the side liner panels by sliding them into place (**Figures 9 and 10**).
- 5a. Brick patterned liner panels: using the long retaining brackets, insert the bottom tab behind the lower front edge of the Firebox and secure the top with a #8 x 3/8" Phillips screw provided with this manual (**Figure 9**).
NOTE: Bracket will capture the front and back sides of the panel.
- 5b. Steel and Porcelain panels: using the short 'L' brackets, secure the liner panels by fastening the bracket to the top edge of the Firebox with a #8 x 3/8" Phillips screw provided with this manual (**Figure 10**).

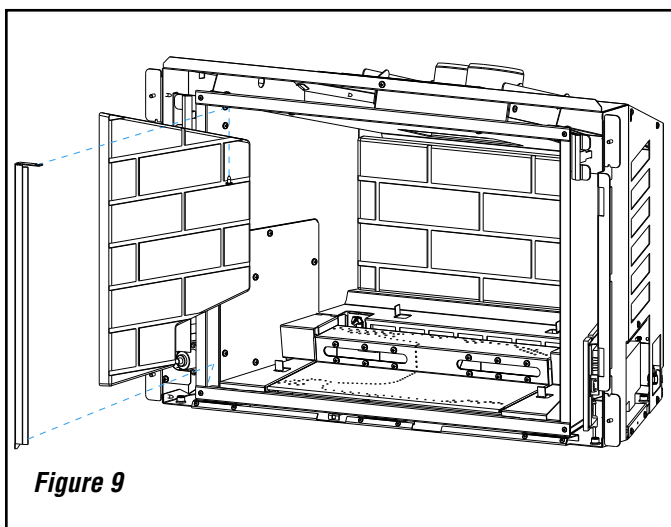

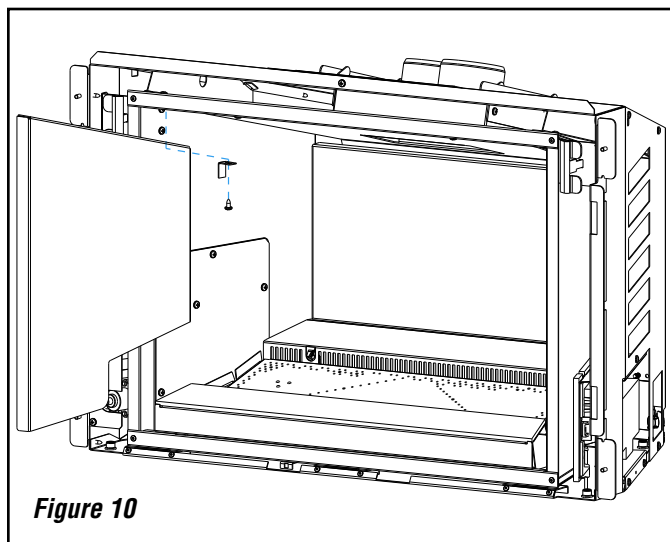

You will need to follow the instructions for either the media for Contemporary models OR Logs for the Traditional models.

Log Installation for Traditional Model MPI27-B

NOTE: If applicable, install the firebox liners before placing the volcanic stone embers on the burner. Logs can be installed after the stone embers.

Installing the volcanic stone, and glowing embers:

- 1. If necessary, remove the glass door (**Page 30**).
- 2. Spread the decorative volcanic stone on the firebox floor to the front and sides of the burner (**Figure 12**).

- NOTE: Do not place volcanic stone on the burner.**

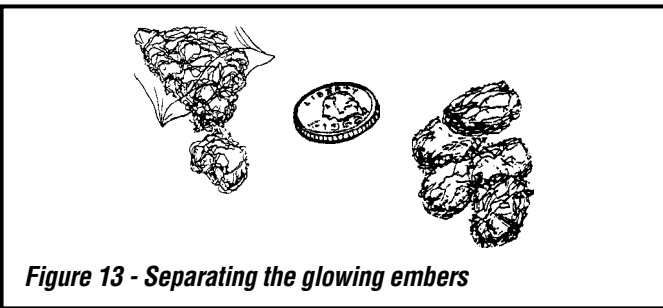


Figure 13 - Separating the glowing embers

- 3. Separate and fluff the glowing embers into pieces approximately the size of a quarter (**Figure 13**).
 - 4. Position the separated glowing embers over the small holes on the burner surface (**Figure 14**). **Do NOT cover the large burner slots.**
- NOTE:** Enough glowing ember material is provided for several applications. For best glowing effect, replace the ember material annually.

Log Installation Instructions - MPI27-B

The logs have notches/tabs to assist proper positioning. Upper logs rest on lower logs via notches/tabs. Proper log placement is critical to prevent sooting. Place the logs in the gaps between flame peaks, so they do not impinge the flames. Follow the log placement instructions precisely.

- NOTE:** Do not cover the burner ports.
- NOTE:** Ensure the left front log (1) and right front log (2) are correctly installed on the burner positioning tabs.

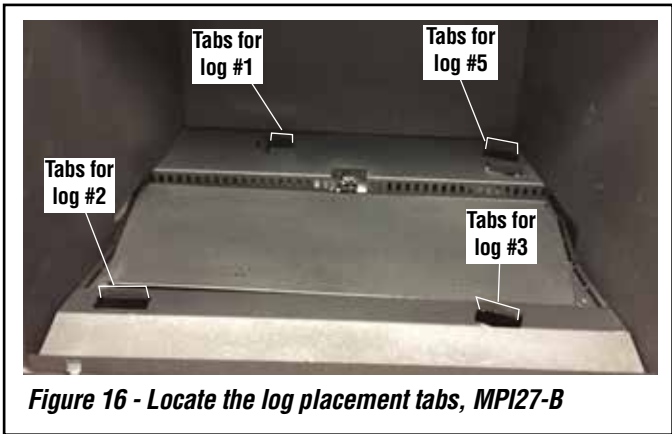


Figure 16 - Locate the log placement tabs, MPI27-B

- 1. If necessary, remove the glass door (**Page 30**). Locate and bend up Burner Locating Tabs (**Figure 16**).
 - 2. Locate the log placement tabs (**Figure 16**). Place embers and other media.

3. Align the notches in the bottom of the rear log (1) with the left rear locating tabs (see **Figures 16 and 17**).

Log Installation for Traditional Models MPI32-B and MPI34-B

If logs are not installed according to the log installation instructions, flame impingement and improper combustion could occur and result in soot and/or excessive production of carbon monoxide (CO), a colorless, odorless, toxic gas.

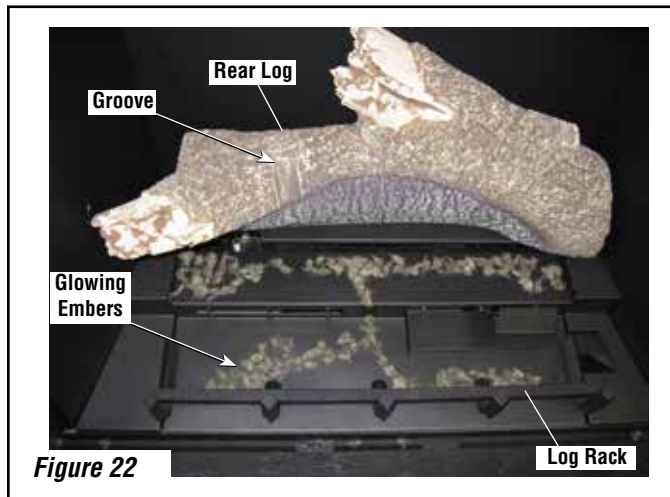
The size and position of the log set is critical to achieve a safe, reliable and attractive flame pattern. Any attempt to use a different log set in the fireplace will void the warranty and will result in incomplete combustion, sooting and poor flame quality.

1. Install the rear log on the back locating tabs (see **Figures 21 and 22**).

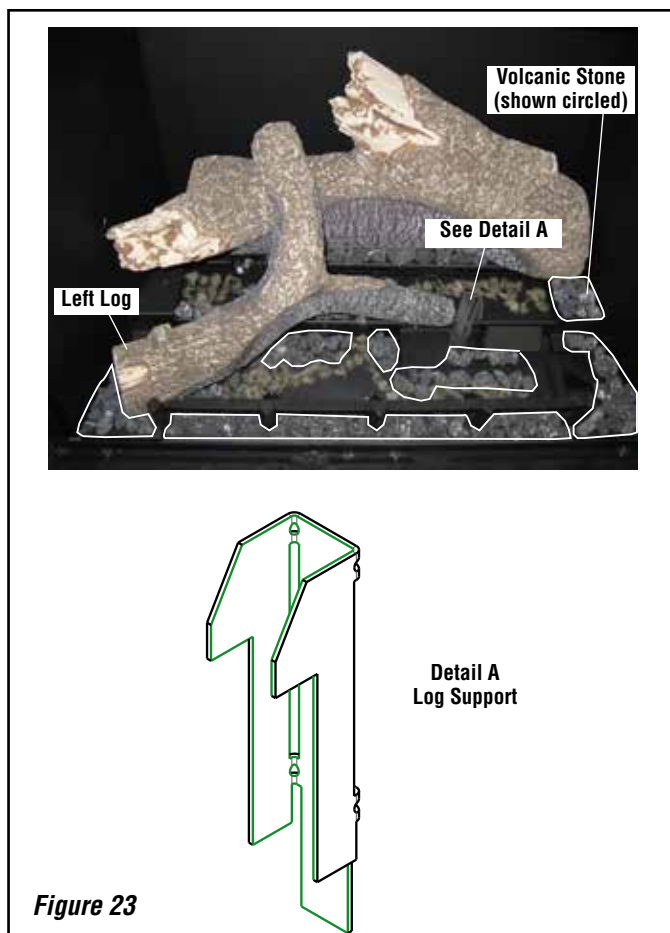
2. Place a layer of glowing embers (rockwool) directly over the ports as shown in **Figure 22**.
 - A light layer will give a more constant rear flame.
 - A heavy layer will give more glow, but may need to be adjusted after light up to prevent sooting and poor flame quality.



3. Install the left log in place as shown in **Figure 23**. The front of the log is pre-molded to fit on the log rack. The rear of the log has a tab that will fit into the groove on the rear log (see **Figures 22 and 23**).
4. Place volcanic stones around the perimeter of the glowing embers (rockwool) in the areas shown in **Figure 23**.

IMPORTANT: Do not cover ports with volcanic stone!

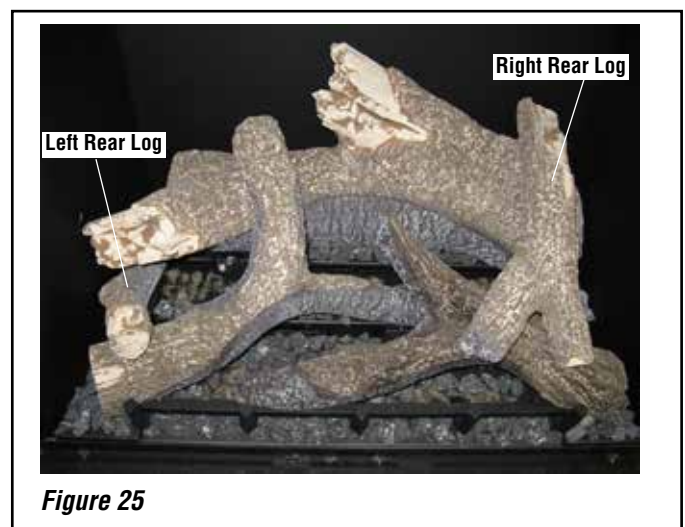
5. Bend log support as shown in **Figure 23** (see detail A) and slide it into the groove on the burner air deflector as shown in **Figure 23**.



6. Install the right log as shown in **Figure 24**. Both sides of the log are pre-molded to fit onto the log rack. Rest rear of log on log support.



7. Install right rear log as shown in **Figure 25**. Each has a mounting tab that will fit into the log that it supports.
8. MPI34-B only: Install the left log as shown in **Figure 25** by locating it on the mounting tab in the front left log.



Surround Installation - All Models

1. Position the appliance in the fireplace, but a few inches in front of its final location.
2. Hang the surround panel on the studs protruding from the surround mounting tabs.
3. Using an 11/32" wrench, secure the surround panel with four #8 washers and 8-32 nuts supplied with this manual.

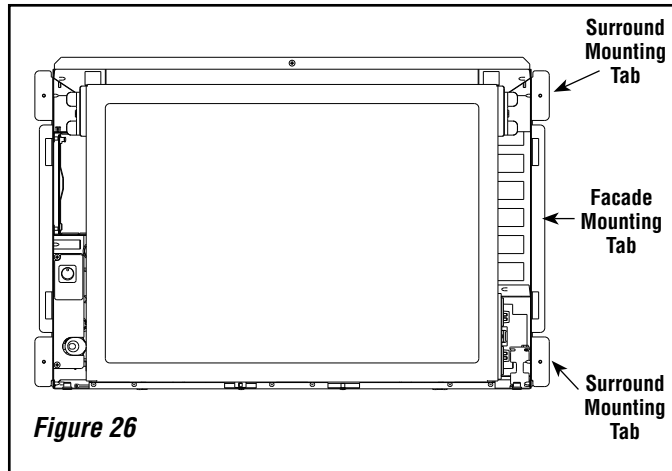

Facade Installation (required accessory) - All Models

A number of different facade styles are available for your appliance. See **Page 37** for ordering information. Install the facade onto the *Facade Mounting Tabs* (see **Figure 26**).

Gas Line Installation

After leveling, position the insert in the fireplace - holding it about six inches out from its final location.

CAUTION: Specific hearth requirements apply (see Clearances to Combustibles).

This appliance must be connected to the gas line in accordance with local codes and/or the National Fuel Gas Code, ANSI Z223.1. This appliance comes with an 5" nipple, provided in the literature package. After connecting the gas line, all joints in the line and connections at the valve should be checked for leaks before final positioning of the unit. Conduct a gas leakage test of the appliance piping and control system downstream of the shutoff valve in the supply line to the appliance.

Gas Pressure Requirements

A MAJOR CAUSE OF OPERATING PROBLEMS WITH GAS APPLIANCES IS IMPROPER GAS PRESSURE!

The most important item to check during the initial installation and the first thing to check when operating problems occur is gas pressure! This appliance will not function properly unless the required gas pressure is supplied. See the table on this page for gas pressure requirements.

Two pressure taps are provided on the appliance's valve to check gas pressures (see **Figure 26** for locations). To check inlet pressure (with the appliance burning), insert a small flat blade screwdriver into the tap and turn a half turn counter-clockwise. Cover the tap with the line from a manometer and check the pressure. Close the tap gently but securely

after completing the check. To check manifold pressure (with the appliance burning at the high burn setting) insert a small flat blade screwdriver into the tap and turn a half turn counter-clockwise. Cover the tap with the line from the manometer and check the pressure. Again, close the tap gently but securely after completing the check. Check the taps for gas leaks with a gas leak test solution (retighten if necessary).

If the pressure is not sufficient, make sure the gas supply line is large enough, the supply regulator is properly adjusted and the total gas load for the residence does not exceed the amount supplied.

Propane tanks are at pressures that will cause damage to valve components. Verify that the tanks have step down regulators to reduce the pressure to safe levels.

The appliance must be isolated from the gas supply piping system by closing its equipment shutoff valve during any pressure testing of the gas supply piping system at test pressures **equal to or less than** 1/2 psig (3.5 kPa).

The appliance and its appliance main gas valve must be disconnected from the gas supply piping system during any pressure testing of that system at test pressures **in excess of** 1/2 psig (3.5 kPa).

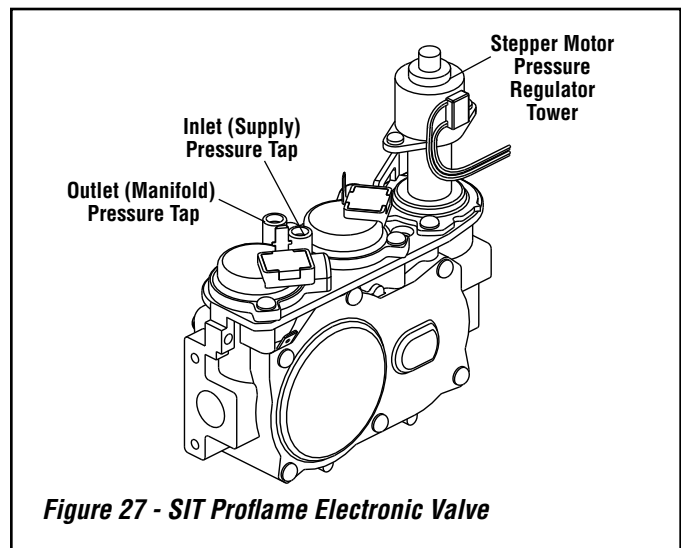


Figure 27 - SIT Proflame Electronic Valve

LP and Natural Gas Supplies

This appliance is equipped from the factory for use with natural gas only as specified on the Safety / Listing label attached to the appliance. This appliance can only be operated using propane gas (LP) if a certified fuel conversion kit provided by IHP is installed by a qualified service technician.

Also check the orifice size on the label which is located in the control compartment. It must be the correct size for the fuel and altitude.

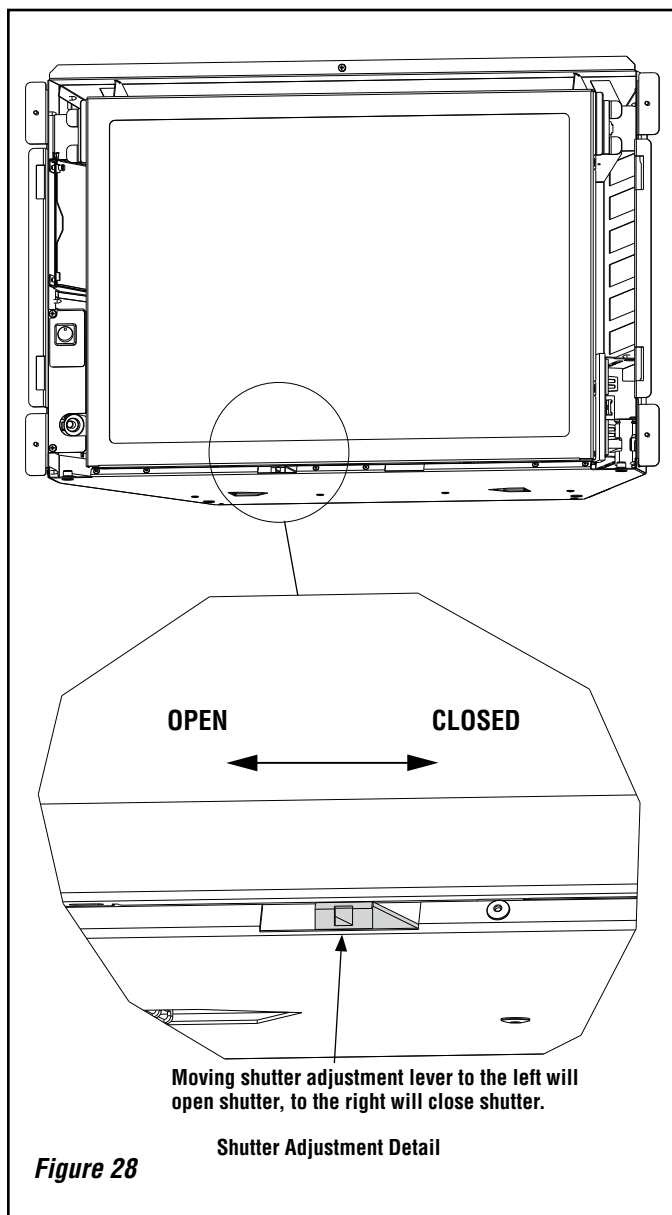
Do not run propane tank dry. Running the tank dry may cause a hazardous condition due to pressure drop in empty tank.

Solid fuel is NOT to be used with this appliance.

Air Shutter Adjustment

This appliance has an air shutter control lever located behind the facade, under the glass door (see **Figure 28**). The lever is linked to the primary air shutter on the main burner. The air shutter regulates the amount of primary air the burner receives and therefore how clean the insert burns. The air shutter should only be adjusted by a qualified gas technician. The insert should burn for about 15 minutes with the logs or glass media installed before adjusting the air shutter. More air will result in shorter flames and less color, less air will result in bigger flames and more color. To adjust the air shutter, slide the adjustment lever side to side (see **Figure 28**).

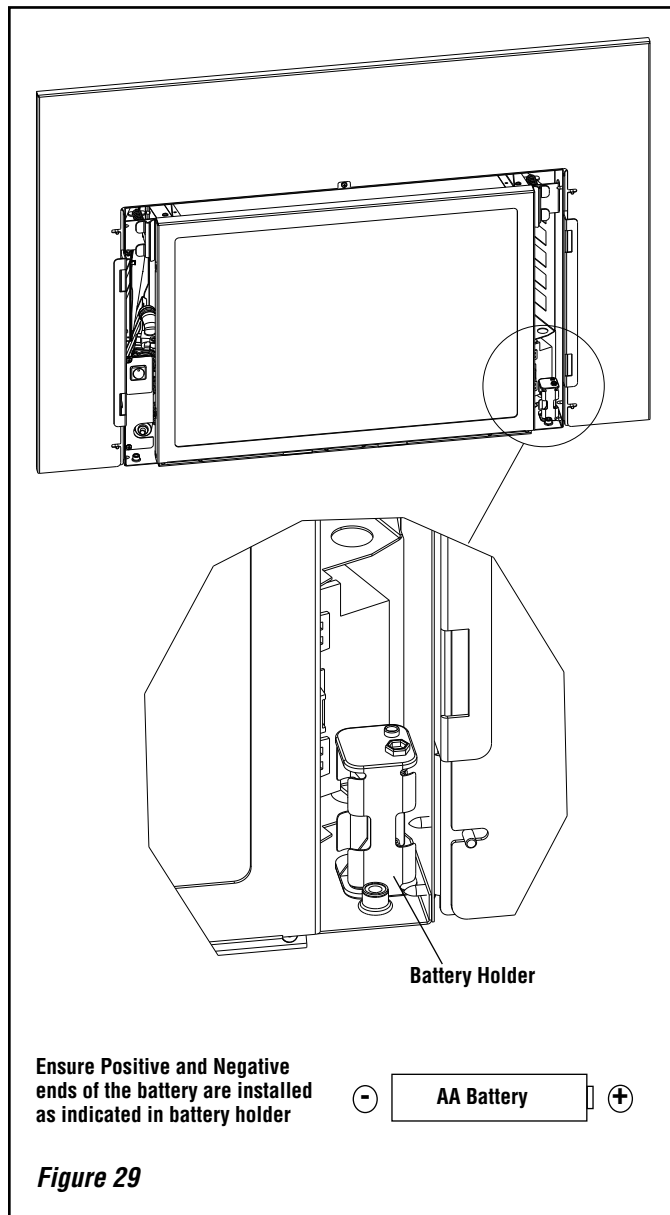
CAUTION: The air shutter should never be set so as to make the tips of the flames sooty or create sooting on the viewing glass, logs, or heat exchanger. If soot begins to form after burning, the air shutter should be opened gradually until the sooting condition stops. Gas quality and gas pressure may vary, which can affect the burning characteristics of the insert.



Battery Backup - Battery Installation

This appliance is equipped with a battery backup system. It requires four (4) "AA" batteries to power the appliance (without the blower) during a power outage. Install the batteries into the battery holder per instructions in **Figure 29**.

Batteries, even if not used, will gradually drain over time. It is recommended to annually check the batteries for sufficient charge and replace when necessary.



OPERATION

Pre-Lighting Checklist

Be sure to check these items before the initial lighting of the insert:

- ☐ Gas pressure has been checked carefully - see **Page 22**.
- ☐ All gas fittings have been checked for leaks.
- ☐ All clearances to combustibles have been met-see **Page 14 and 15**.
- ☐ All combustible materials have been removed from the area in front of the insert.
- ☐ All vented areas of the insert face are unobstructed.
- ☐ House is ventilated to clear initial paint curing odors - see **Page 27**.
- ☐ All packaging materials have been removed from the firebox.
- ☐ Firebox liner panels and log set or glass media have been installed.
- ☐ The glass door is in place and is properly sealed.
- ☐ The accent light bulb has been installed.

Operating Instructions

FOR YOUR SAFETY READ BEFORE OPERATING

WARNING: If you do not follow these instructions exactly, a fire or explosion may result causing property damage, personal injury or loss of life.

A. This appliance is equipped with an ignition device which automatically lights the pilot. Do not try to light the pilot by hand.

B. BEFORE OPERATING smell all around the appliance area for gas. Be sure to smell next to the floor because some gas is heavier than air and will settle on the floor.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU SMELL GAS:

- Do not try to light any appliance.
 - Do not touch any electric switch; do not use any phone in your building.
 - Immediately call your gas supplier from a neighbor's phone. Follow the gas supplier's instructions.
 - If you cannot reach your gas supplier, call the fire department.
- C. If any portion of this appliance does not operate as the instructions indicate, do not try to repair it, call a qualified service technician. Do not use tools. Force or attempted repair may result in a fire or explosion.
- D. Do not use this appliance if any part has been under water. Immediately call a qualified service technician to inspect the appliance and to replace any part of the control system and any gas control which has been under water.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

1. The Main Power switch located in the control compartment functions as a burner and pilot override switch. When in the OFF position, it will not let the burner or pilot to be turned on by the remote. When in the ON position, it gives the remote full control over burner and pilot functions.
2. See Remote Control System on **Page 25** for remote specific operating instructions.

TO TURN OFF GAS TO APPLIANCE

1. Turn the main power ON/OFF switch in the control compartment to "OFF."
2. Turn off all electric power to the appliance if service is to be performed.
3. Close the main line gas shut-off valve.

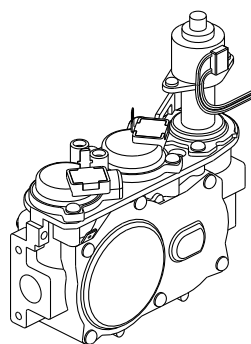

Intermittent/Standing Pilot Mode

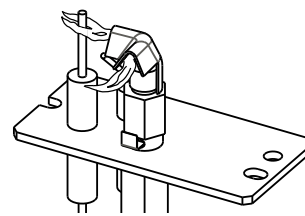
(On/Auto Pilot Mode Switch)

This appliance can be switched from intermittent ignition to a standing pilot simply by using the remote to switch from IPI to CPI. This is done when the remote is in the off position. Press the mode key and use the up/down arrow key to change between IPI and CPI. To save energy, switch to intermittent mode. To have a standing pilot which will help startup during cold climate conditions by warming the flue and the glass, switch to standing pilot.

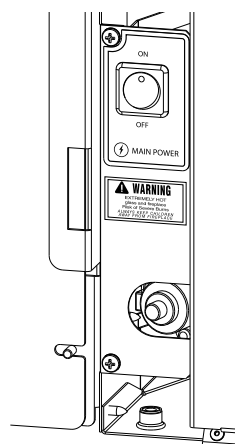
The continuous pilot mode is indicated by a pilot that comes on and remains lit when the fireplace is off.

OPERATION - ALL MODELS

Remote Control System

The Remote allows you to command the functions of your appliance from the comfort of your chair and is configured to control the On/Off primary burner operation, its flame height through six (6) levels, and provides On/Off and Smart thermostatic control of the appliance.

The system controls blower speed through six (6) levels and has a constantly powered 120V/60Hz power outlet.

The remote sends commands via radio frequency from the Remote (transmitter) and does not require line-of-sight operation.

Initializing The System For The First Time

To initialize the system you will press the red "PRG" button which is located on the control board on the top as you are looking at the unit. The control board is located on the right side of the unit. Once the "PRG" button is pressed the control board will beep three times.

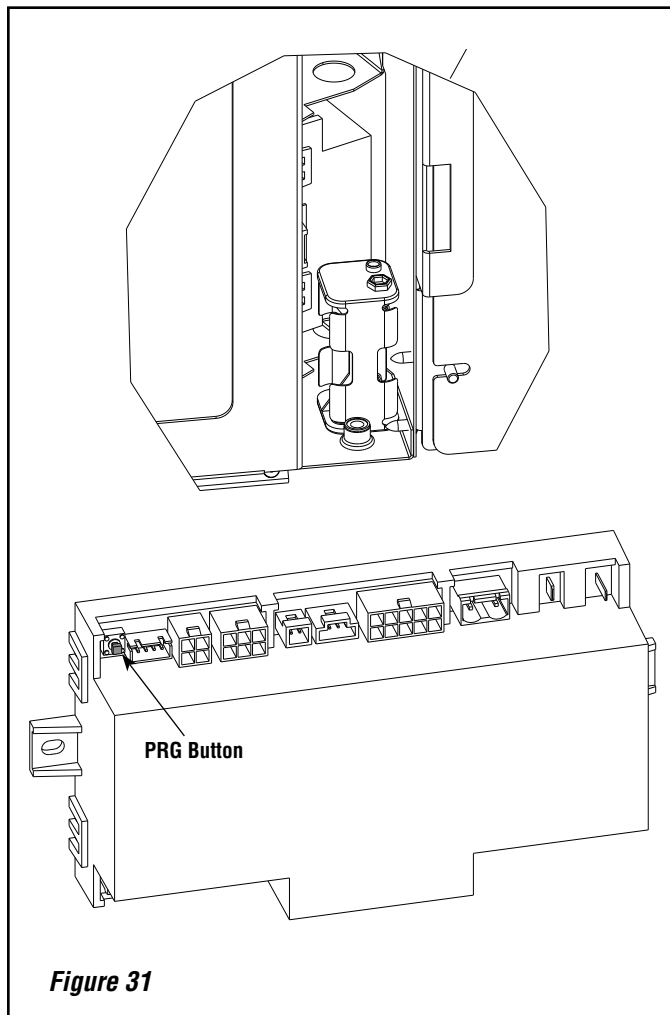

Install 3 AAA type batteries in the Remote (transmitter) battery bay, located on the base of the Remote. With the batteries already installed in the Remote, push the ON button. The Receiver will "beep" three times to indicate the Remote's command is accepted and sets to the particular code of that Remote. The system is now initialized.

Low Battery Power Detection

The life span of the Receiver batteries depends on various factors: quality of the batteries used, the number of ignitions of the appliance, the number of changes to the room thermostat set point, etc.

When the Receiver batteries are low, two "beeps" will be emitted from the Receiver when it receives an ON/OFF command from the Remote.

This is an alert for a low battery condition for the Receiver. When the batteries are replaced the "beep" will be emitted from the Receiver when the ON/OFF key is pressed (See Initializing The System).

WARNING

Fire hazard. Can cause severe injury or death. The receiver causes ignition of the appliance. The appliance can turn on suddenly. Keep away from the appliance burner when operating the remote system or activating manual bypass of the remote system.

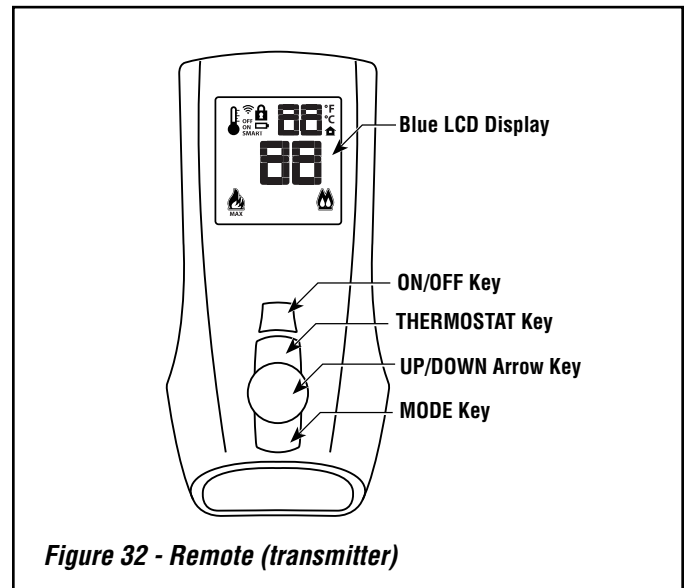


Figure 32 - Remote (transmitter)

CAUTION

Property damage hazard. Excessive heat can cause property damage. The appliance can stay lit for many hours. Turn off the appliance if it is not going to be attended for any length of time. Always place the Transmitter where children cannot reach it.

OPERATION - ALL MODELS

Temperature Indicator Display

With the system in the “OFF” position, press the Thermostat Key and the Mode Key at the same time (see **Figure 32**). Look at the LCD screen on the Remote to verify that a C or F is visible to the right of the Room Temperature display (see **Figure 33**).

Turn On The Appliance

Press the ON/OFF Key on the Remote. The Remote display will show all active Icons on the screen (see **Figure 33**) and the appliance main burner will turn on. A single “beep” from the Receiver will confirm reception of the command.

Turn Off The Appliance

Press the ON/OFF Key on the Remote. The Remote LCD display will only show the room temperature and Icon and the appliance burner will turn off. A single “beep” from the Receiver confirms reception of the command.

Remote Flame Control

The system has six (6) flame levels. See **Figure 34** for an example. With the system on, and the flame level at the maximum in the appliance, pressing the Down Arrow Key once will reduce the flame height by one step until the flame is turned off.

The Up Arrow Key will increase the flame height each time it is pressed. If the Up Arrow Key is pressed while the system is on but the flame is off, the flame will come on in the high position (see **Figure 35**). A single “beep” will confirm reception of the command.

Room Thermostat (Remote Operation)

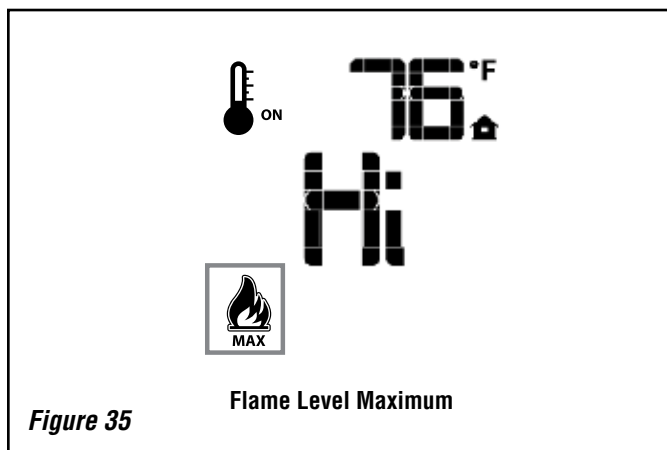
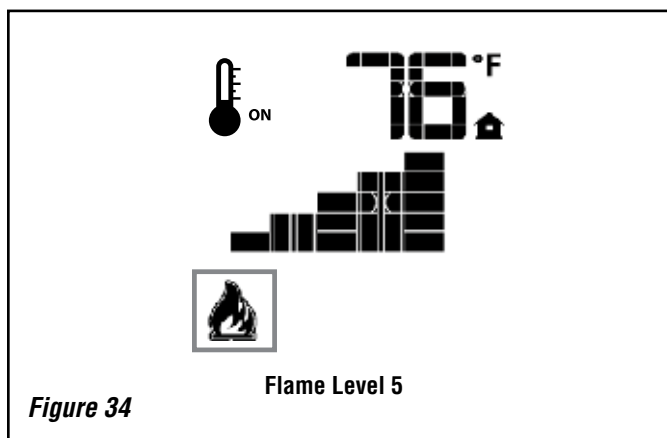
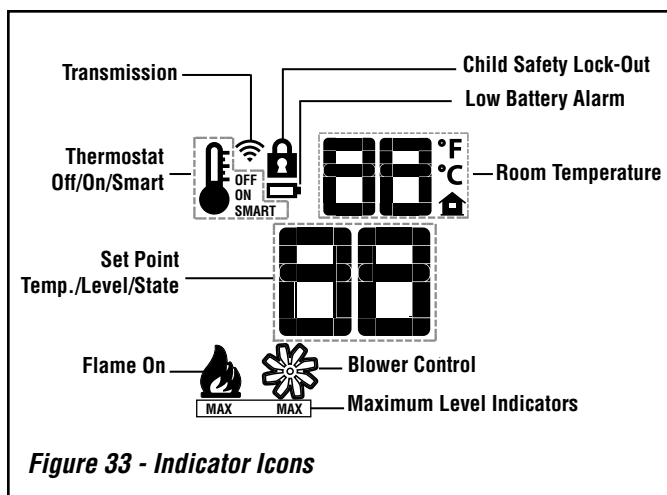
The Remote Control can operate as a room thermostat. The thermostat can be set to a desired temperature to control the comfort level in a room.

To activate this function, press the Thermostat Key. The LCD display on the Remote will change to show that the room temperature is “ON” and the set temperature is now displayed (see **Figure 33**). To adjust the set temperature, press the Up or Down Arrow Keys until the desired set temperature is displayed on the LCD screen of the Remote.

Smart Thermostat (Remote Operation)

The smart Thermostat function adjusts the flame height in accordance to the difference between the set point temperature and the actual room temperatures. As the room temperature gets closer to the set point, the Smart Function will modulate the flame down.

To activate this function, press the Thermostat Key until the word “SMART” appears to the right of the temperature bulb graphic. To adjust the set temperature, press the Up or Down Arrow Keys until the desired set temperature is displayed on the LCD screen of the Remote (see **Figure 33**).



WARNING

THE REMOTE (TRANSMITTER) AND RECEIVER ARE RADIO FREQUENCY DEVICES. PLACING THE RECEIVER IN OR NEAR METAL MAY SEVERELY REDUCE THE SIGNAL RANGE.

OPERATION - ALL MODELS

Blower Speed Control

This appliance is equipped with a hot air circulating blower. The speed of the blower is controlled by the Remote. The blower speed can be adjusted through six (6) levels.

Blower speed will be indicated by either an Off, Level Bar, or HI shown in the Set Point/Temp/Level/State indicator area.

To activate this function use the Mode Key to index to the blower control icon (see **Figures 32 and 33**). Use the Up/Down Arrow keys to turn on, off or adjust the blower speed. A single “beep” will confirm reception of the command.

Blower Operation

This appliance comes equipped with a 150 CFM blower with a variable speed control and a time activated switch. **NOTE:** *Time activated switch only applies to Room Thermostat and Smart Thermostat modes.*

Operation:

1. Plug the power cord into a grounded (three-prong) outlet. This appliance is equipped with a three-prong (grounding) plug for your protection against shock hazard and should be plugged directly into a properly grounded three-prong receptacle. Do not cut or remove the grounding prong from this plug.
2. After the appliance is operating for 5 minutes, the blower will turn on if you have selected it using the remote.
3. You can adjust the blower level at any time by using the remote.

Key Lock

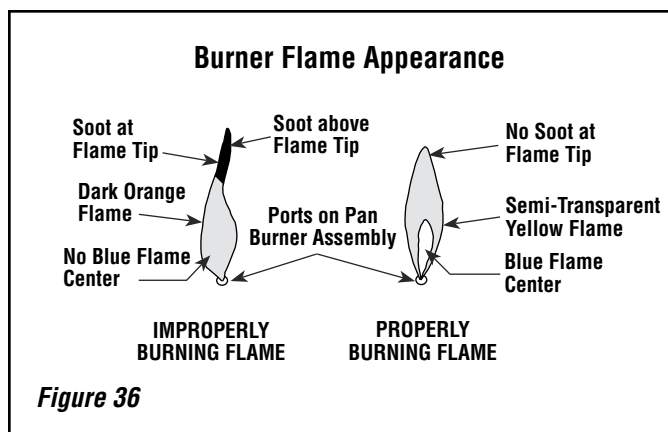
This function will lock the keys to avoid unsupervised operation. To activate this function, press the MODE and UP keys at the same time. To de-activate this function, press MODE and UP Keys at the same time.

Flame Color and Behavior

This appliance is designed for maximum heating efficiency. Therefore, upon lighting of the main burner, the flames will be semi-transparent or “bluish.” After 10-20 minutes of operation the logs will heat up and the flames will become a yellow/orange color.

Adjusting the appliance to cause the flames to turn orange sooner may result in poor combustion, sooting and a hazardous situation. See **Figure 36** showing proper flame appearance.

When testing for proper operation - If an optional thermostat is installed adjust it to its highest temperature setting. Visually determine that main burner gas is burning properly: i.e., no floating, lifting or flashback. Adjust the primary air shutter(s) as required. Check for proper main burner operation at both high and low flame.



Paint Curing

This appliance has been painted with a high temperature satin black stove paint. It leaves the factory dry to the touch, but finishes curing as the appliance is used. Fire the appliance four successive times for ten minutes each time with a five minute cool down between each firing. Ventilate the house during these first firings as the paint gives off an unpleasant odor. It is recommended that persons sensitive to an imbalance in the indoor air quality avoid the appliance during the curing process.

Quiet Operation

As the appliance is burning, a number of normal operational sounds may be heard. The flow of gas through the gas valve and orifice may make a rushing or whistling noise. If this noise is objectionable, it can be reduced by turning down the flame. Turning down the flame can reduce total heat output by more than 30%. When the blower turns on, the sound of rushing air may be heard. The blower sounds may be reduced by adjusting the speed of the blower assembly. Also, a slight clicking sound may be heard as the gas valve or blower switch turn on and off.

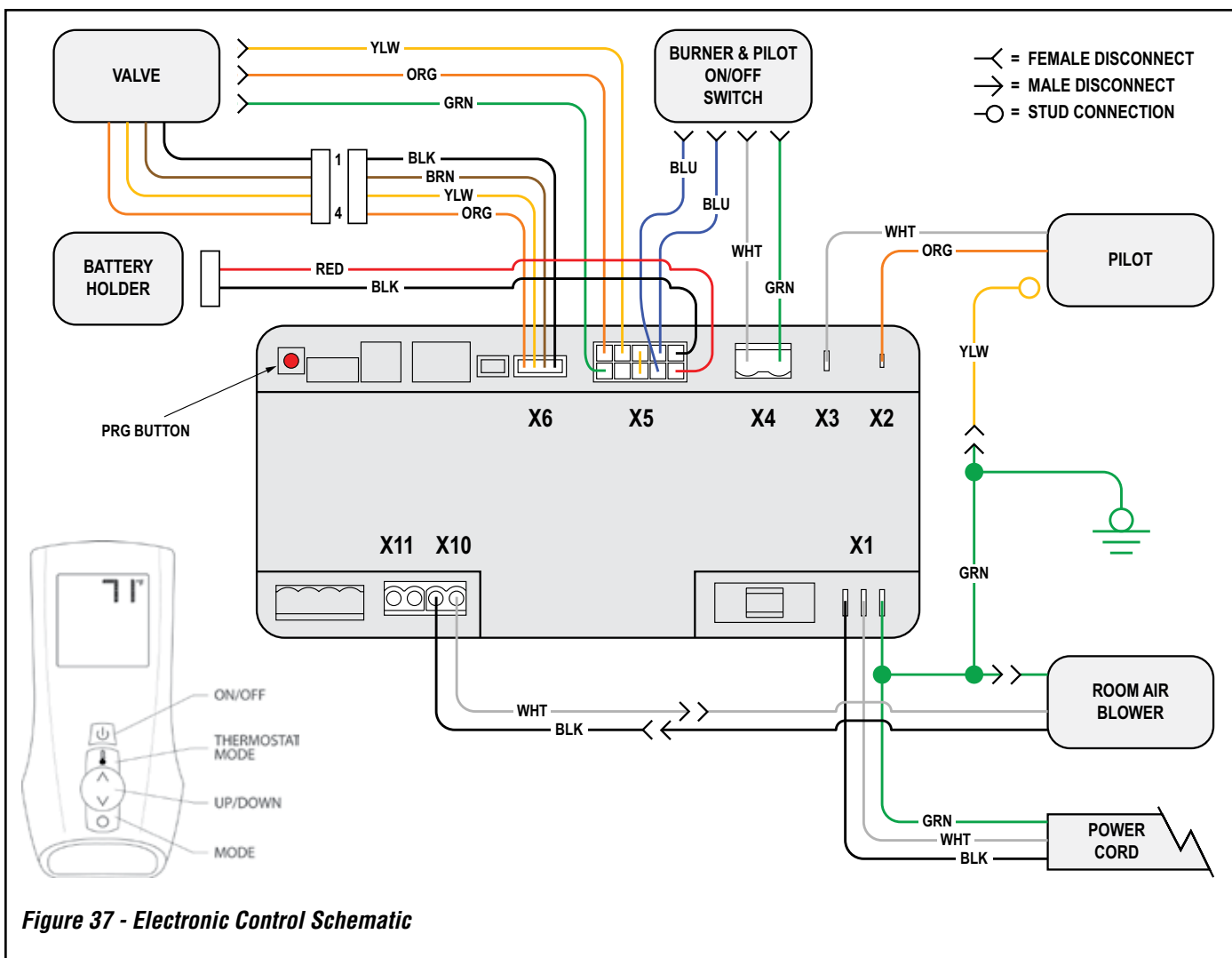


Figure 37 - Electronic Control Schematic

WARNING

CAUTION: Wear gloves and safety glasses for protection while performing required maintenance.

Verify proper operation after servicing.

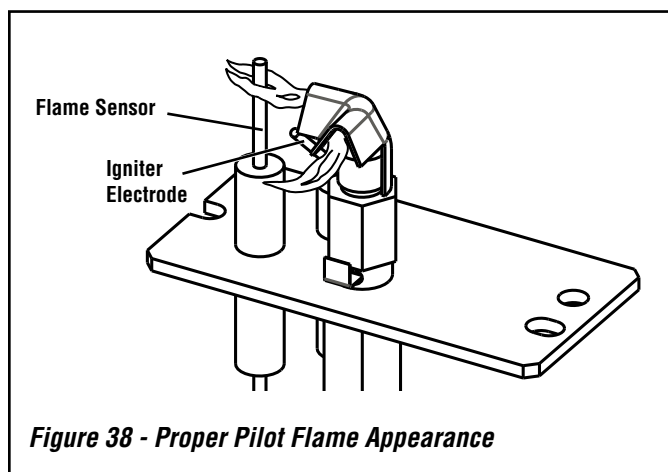
MAINTENANCE CHECKLIST

The following should only be performed by a qualified service technician.

1. Annual inspection should be made and the following checks performed:

- ☐ When unit is cool, remove glass and inspect burner for dirt, soot and lint accumulations and remove if necessary. If excessive soot accumulation is present on burner, have a qualified service technician adjust the burner for proper combustion.
- ☐ Clean inside of glass with gas fireplace glass cleaner. NEVER attempt to remove or clean the glass when the unit is hot.
- ☐ Check the hot air outlet vents for lint or other accumulations. Never block or restrict vent openings, obstruct flow of ventilation air, or use vents other than those approved for use with this appliance.
- ☐ Check that the chimney and its outlet are open and free of soot, blockage, or debris. The venting system should be periodically examined by a qualified agency.
- ☐ Check gaskets once a year. Gaskets must be tight. Replace if necessary.
- ☐ Periodically inspect the pilot system for proper flame. Turn the pilot ON/Auto switch to the ON position. Ensure the igniter lights the pilot. The pilot flame should engulf the flame sensor as shown in **Figure 38**. See *Intermittent/Standing Pilot Mode* on **Page 24** for instructions on switching from intermittent ignition to a standing pilot.
- ☐ Periodically inspect the burner flame for proper appearance. See *Flame Color and Behavior* on **Page 27**.
- ☐ Check that the area around the insert is kept clear and is free of combustible materials, gasoline and other flammable vapors and liquids.

2. The viewing glass should be cleaned periodically (see *Glass Maintenance*).



Glass Door

WARNING

- Do not attempt to substitute the materials used on these doors, or replace cracked or broken glass.
- Handle this glass with extreme care! Glass is susceptible to damage— Do not scratch or handle roughly while reinstalling the glass door frame.
- The glass door(s) of this appliance must only be replaced as a complete unit as provided by the manufacturer. Do not attempt to replace broken, cracked or chipped glass separately.
- Do not attempt to touch the front enclosure glass with your hands while the appliance is in use.
- Do not use abrasive cleaners. Never clean the glass when it is hot.
- **DO NOT** abuse glass door by striking or slamming shut.

CAUTION

Do not operate the appliance with glass removed, cracked, or broken. Replacement of the panel(s) should be done by a licensed or qualified service person.

ATTENTION

Do not remove glass door while the appliance is hot.

Glass Door Removal

To remove the glass door:

1. Remove the facade by following the instructions on **Page 32** (see section *Removing The Damaged Barrier* and follow steps 1, 2 and 3).
2. Unhook the latches from the upper left and right sides of the door by pulling out and rotating to the side.
3. The door can now be pulled from the top away from the Firebox then lifted up and off the Firebox base.
4. To reinstall the door, complete the steps in reverse order.

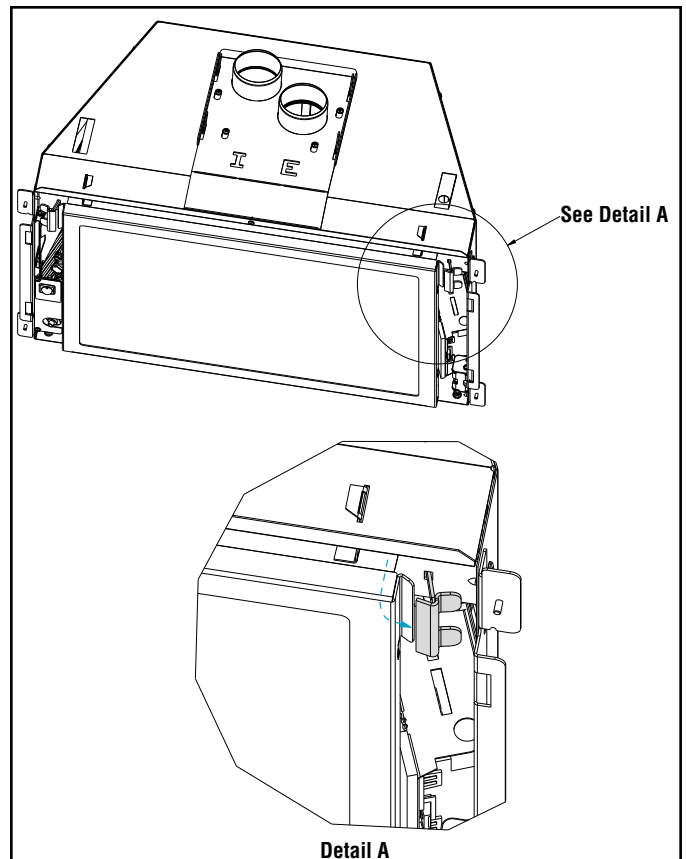

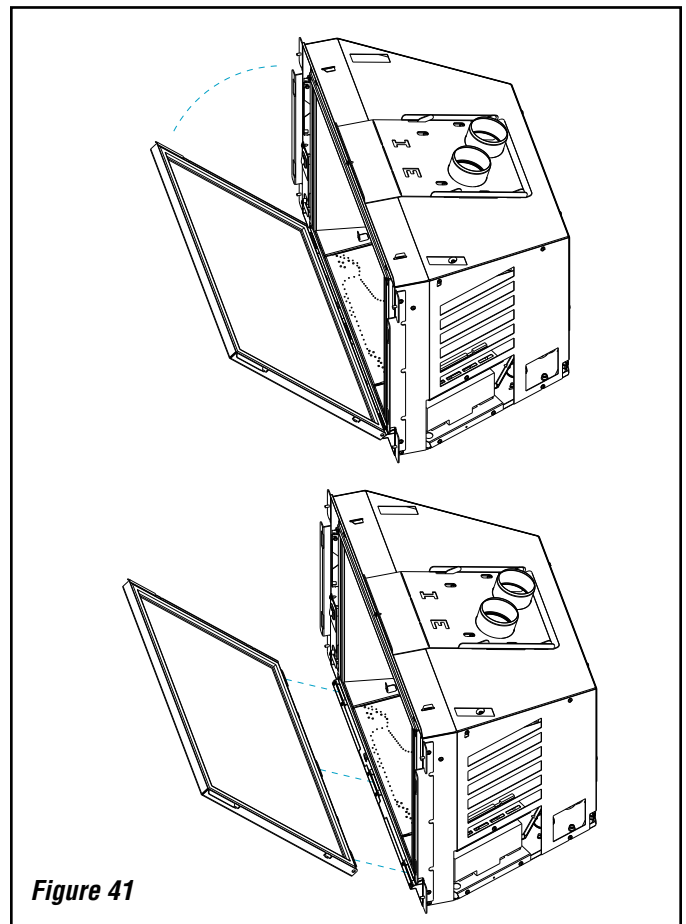

Glass Door Cleaning and Maintenance

Cleaning: Do not remove or clean the glass door when hot. When cool, the glass may be cleaned with a clean, soft cloth and a household glass cleaner. For cleaning white condensation from the interior glass, use a gas fireplace glass cleaner available from your dealer. Use of caustic or abrasive cleaners may damage the glass. DO NOT spray commercial glass cleaner with ammonia on the door and glass gasket as it may dissolve the gasket glue.



WARNING

- DO NOT use abrasive cleaners on glass.
- DO NOT clean glass when hot.

Repair: If the glass is broken in the glass door, the entire door (metal frame, gasket and glass) should be replaced as a unit. This replacement glass door is available from your IHP dealer. Do not use substitute parts or materials. The glass is neo-ceramic and alternative types must not be used.

NOTE: BE CAREFUL NOT TO SPRAY COMMERCIAL GLASS CLEANER WITH AMMONIA ON GASKET AREA OF DOOR. AMMONIA WILL DISSOLVE GASKET GLUE.

Fuel Conversion

Converting this appliance between natural gas and propane (LP) can be accomplished by installing a gas conversion kit. Only a qualified service technician should perform the conversion.

Gas Conversion Kits: Please see instructions provided with conversion kit.

Blower Removal

Unplug the power supply cord from the electrical outlet prior to removing the blower. The blower can be accessed on the back of the insert.

1. Remove the insert from the fireplace.

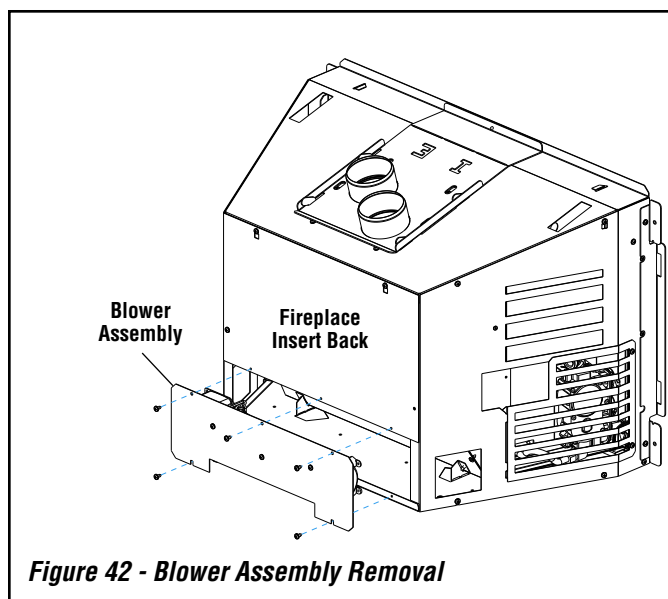


Figure 42 - Blower Assembly Removal

2. Remove five phillips screws holding fan assembly in place and carefully move assembly out of the way, exposing appliance wiring (see **Figure 42**).
3. Disconnect the fan wiring from the appliance.

To re-install the blower, repeat these steps in reverse order.

Electrical Requirements:

Removing The Damaged Barrier (refer to Figure 43a and 43b)

1. Make sure the unit is OFF and COLD.
2. Remove the facade by lifting it up and away from the unit to unseat the facade hooks from the mounting slots on the unit.
3. Place the facade face down on a soft, non-abrasive surface to prevent damage.
4. Remove barrier from facade:

Contemporary, Santa Fe and Full View Facades (see Figure 43a) -

- a. Using a 3/8" nut driver, remove and set aside the four nuts and 'Z' brackets holding each corner of the barrier in place.
- b. Remove the damaged barrier from the facade and discard.

Deco Facades (see Figure 43a) -

- a. Using a 3/8" nut driver, remove and set aside the two nuts and 'Z' brackets holding the top corners of the barrier in place.
- b. Using a flat blade screwdriver, carefully pry up the two tabs holding the bottom corners of the barrier in place.
- c. Remove the damaged barrier from the facade and discard.

Vista Facades (see Figure 43b)

- a. Using a 3/8" nut driver, remove and set aside the four nuts holding the upper and lower barrier retainers.
- b. Remove the upper and lower barrier retainers, including the two side bezel pieces that are captured by them.
- c. Remove the two nuts holding the left side facade mounting bracket and set bracket aside.
- d. Remove the damaged barrier and discard.

Installing The New Listed Barrier

1. Place new barrier onto the back of the facade and reattach by following removal instructions in reverse order, taking care not to over-tighten the nuts.
2. Reinstall the facade by seating the four hooks on the back of the facade into the mounting slots on the unit.

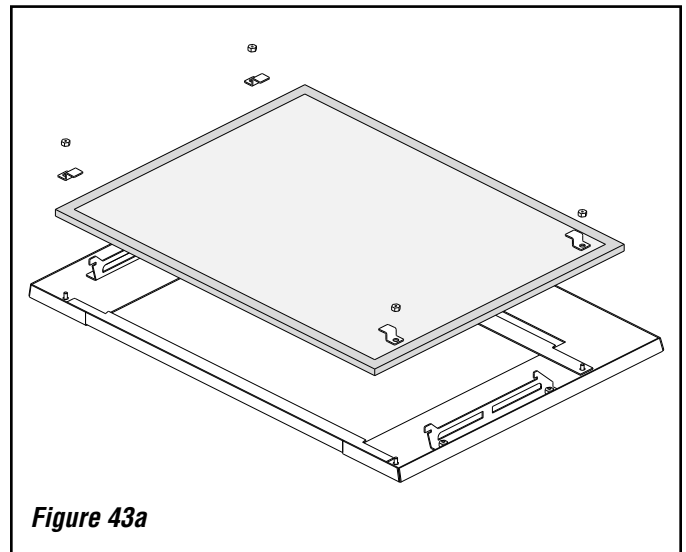

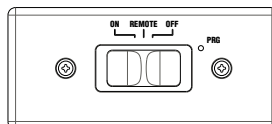
Electronic Gas Control Valve - SIT Proflame
